The Northwest AETC offers continuing education on HIV treatment to doctors, nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, dental professionals, clinical pharmacists, and other members of the health care team. It trains providers from Ryan White CARE Act funded agencies, federally funded community and migrant health centers, tribal health clinics, state and local health departments, corrections facilities, and private practice settings serving persons with HIV and AIDS. The NW AETC offers a national education program on palliative care issues related to HIV and AIDS, and Minority AIDS Initiative programming specifically targeting minority providers, providers serving HIV-infected persons of color, and minority-specific community based organizations. The mission of the national AETC network is to sustain and expand the base of health care providers who are effectively educated and motivated to counsel, diagnose, treat and manage individuals with HIV infection and to assist in the prevention of high risk behaviors which may lead to infection.
